How to vote: Agreement in Principle 2021 (Schools)

Voting commences on the Agreement in Principle 2021 (Schools) at 9am Monday 30 May. It is important that all members register a vote.

How to vote:

Step 1: Review the voter information pack and other materials outlining the Agreement in Principle. Find them at sstuwa.org.au/GA2021

Step 2: Register your vote. The process will only take about two minutes.

- You will receive an eNews at 9am on Monday 30 May with a link to the online voting page.
- Click the **vote now** button (the button will not be visible before 9am Monday). The button will take you to our online voting form on Survey Monkey.
- Complete the fields and click the **submit now** button.

You will need your member number to submit your vote. It will be included in the eNews you receive on Monday 30 May.

Note: Union reps may opt to conduct a branch vote. Your union rep will advise you if this is the case.

You may vote only once - **either** as an individual online **or** have your vote recorded in a branch vote.

Voting opens: 9am Monday 30 May 2022

Voting closes: 4pm Friday 17 June 2022

Members will be informed via eNews of the outcome after the count is complete.
